Amy-Jill Levine is E. Rhodes and Leona B. Carpenter Professor of New Testament Studies at Vanderbilt University Divinity School, Department of Religious Studies, and Graduate Department of Religion. Her most recent publications include *The Misunderstood Jew: The Church and the Scandal of the Jewish Jesus* (HarperOne, 2006), the edited collection, *The Historical Jesus in Context* (Princeton University Press, 2006) and the fourteen-volume *Feminist Companions to the New Testament and Early Christian Writings* (Continuum). A self-described "Yankee Jewish feminist" who teaches in a predominantly Protestant divinity school in the buckle of the Bible Belt," Levine combines historical-critical rigor, literary-critical sensitivity, and a frequent dash of humor with a commitment to eliminating antisemitic, sexist, and homophobic theologies. She also attends an Orthodox Synagogue.
