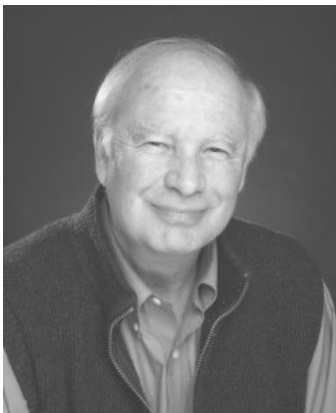


A presentation by Craig Rennebohm, Mental Health Chaplain and

Craig has taught in settings ranging from local congregations in Seattle, to seminars in Jamaica and Bosnia. His creative work at the intersection of spirituality and mental illness was recognized most recently with NAMI's 2009 Richard T. Greer Award for Advocacy.
